- Parishioners, who work in concrete ways to make our parish true communities of faith and vibrant sources of service to the larger community.



LITURGY & WORSHIP

Eucharistic Adoration

St. John Paul II in his encyclical "Redemptor Hominis" (Redeemer of Man) called upon the whole People of God to make Jesus the very center of the universe and history (3). In the same encyclical he says the Eucharist is the center and summit of sacramental life...the Eucharist builds the Church (47, 48). In the gospel of Matthew, Jesus asked the disciples to keep watch at the Garden of Gethsemane while he prayed. When he returned and found them sleeping, Jesus says "so could you not watch with me one hour "(Matt 26:49). The gospels talk of Jesus praying and seeking his Father's will for his life. We see pictures of St John Paul II and Saint Teresa of Calcutta praying before the Eucharist. St. John Vianney spent most of his long hours in prayer before the Blessed Sacrament.

Eucharistic Adoration takes place on each Tuesday from 10 AM to 6:45 PM followed by Benediction. Mass is celebrated at 7 PM. All are welcomed to stop by and pray for a few minutes, a half hour or for an extended period of time.

Private prayer and reflection is the basis for Eucharistic Adoration.

There are aids to guide you if you are not familiar with Eucharistic Adoration. Two permanent people are scheduled for each hour.

St. Nicholas is blessed with many faithful to help out, but there is always and need and in no way could we possibly create "too much" adoration! Children and our youth are welcome at their own times and all are encouraged to join in with this ministry.

SACRAMENTAL PREPARATION

The sacraments are the "the masterworks of God" in the new and everlasting covenant. "The purpose of the sacraments is to sanctify men, to build up the Body of Christ and, finally, to give worship to God. Because they are signs they also instruct. They not only presuppose faith, but by words and objects they also nourish, strengthen, and express it. That is why they are called sacraments of faith."

<u>R.C.I.A.</u>

The Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults is the process for those who seek full membership in the Catholic Church. Primarily for the unbaptized, the rites involve a process of preparation and initiation into the Christian life through Baptism, Confirmation, and Eucharist. The RCIA relies on sponsors who are active parishioners.

Children's Initiation

The Catechumenate for children is the process for children, not baptized as infants, who have reached the age of reason, to become members of the Catholic Church. Through the sacraments of initiation – Baptism, Confirmation and Eucharist – the children celebrate their conversion.

<u>First Eucharist</u>

Preparation sessions for parents and children are held in the winter. Adults are involved with the children as leaders, aides, assistant coordinators, and at social events. Children must be registered in Christian Formation Class.

First Reconciliation

Preparation sessions for parents and children are held in the fall and early winter. Adults are needed to assist with workshops, retreats and office. Children must be registered in Christian Formation Class.

Confirmation

Confirmation is the sacrament whereby baptized Catholics are "more perfectly bound to the Church and are enriched with a special strength of the Holy Spirit. Hence they are as true witnesses of Christ, more strictly obliged to spread and defend the faith by word and deed." In the diocese of Richmond confirmation is received by youth who have completed the 9^{th} grade. Confirmation preparation consists of active enrollment in high school formation as well as participation in Confirmation specific preparation. The full details regarding Confirmation are available in the parish office.
