Commonwealth Catholic Charities'

Cabrini Children's Center at St. Nicholas is a shelter serving unaccompanied children ages 5-17 who are ultimately reunited with family and kin. The children's stay at the shelter is short, usually 30-45 days before they are reunified. During their stay, children receive education, medical care, counseling, recreational opportunities and social support. The shelter is staffed 24/7 and is licensed by the Department of Social Services. Funding for the program is through the federal government. CCC operates a similar shelter in Richmond, VA.



SACRAMENTAL PREPARATION

The sacraments are the "the masterworks of God" in the new and everlasting covenant. The purpose of the sacraments is to sanctify men, to build up the Body of Christ and, finally, to give worship to God. Because they are signs they also instruct. They not only presuppose faith, but by words and objects they also nourish, strengthen, and express it. That is why they are called sacraments of faith.

R.C.I.A.

The Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults is the process for those who seek full membership in the Catholic Church. Primarily for the unbaptized, the rites involve a process of preparation and initiation into the Christian life through Baptism, Confirmation, and Eucharist.
